As the weather gets warmer, the busier we become. Please review these important reminders for the safety of all of our members & staff.

Let's talk about Fuel... and I don't mean the prices.

Did you know that fueling a boat is dangerous business? To escape certain death here's what you need to know....

Gasoline vapors are heavier than air and can spread rapidly into enclosed spaces. You should check the bilges and all closed compartments for gasoline vapors. The sniff test is the most effective method for detecting fuel leaks (unless your sniffer's out of whack because of covid)

For your safety, and ours, here's what you need to do:

- Secure boat to the dock
- Switch off engine
- Extinguish all open flames
- Do not use electrical switches
- No smoking
- Ports, hatches, and doors closed during the fueling process
- Make certain all passengers are ashore
- Determine quantity of fuel required and make sure it is the proper type of fuel
- Hold hose nozzle firmly against fill pipe opening
- Do not overfill
- Wipe up all spillage
- Open ports, hatches, and doors to ventilate after fueling is complete
- Turn blower on for four minutes minimum

- Do the sniff test
- Start engine
- Re-board passengers
- Untie from dock and cast off

Proper fueling techniques also keep our water clean and safe, and help marine life thrive in a healthier environment. We are legally required to report fuel spills, and to take prompt action to clean up any spills that may occur. You are responsible for any environmental damage caused by your fuel spill. So...preventing spills will be beneficial for you and the boating environment.

The main reason you want everyone to get out of the boat when refueling is to reduce the chances of your friends and loved ones getting hurt (and your favorite gas dock attendant AKA Me!) should something go wrong with fueling. Because gasoline vapors are heavier than air, they tend to settle into the lowest parts of the boat. If your boat has an installed blower, it's critical that you use it for the recommended four minutes after fueling. Wind simply won't take away the fumes – only time and your blower will. Make sure you use a marine-rated blower as well. They are ignition protected and designed specifically for removing fuel vapors. Plus, we don't want to see you end up on YouTube.... that's embarrassing for all of us.

This leads me to the next order of business. Why we don't physically pump

your fuel.

We just went over why fueling a boat is such a dangerous activity, which is why we don't want to take away your glory of being so brave. All jokes aside, the reason we don't pump the fuel is for liability and safety purposes. We don't want to accidently put fuel in your water or waste tanks. This could lead to a whole lot of issues, including risk of explosion and literally fuel down the drain. Which no one wants in this economy. Because we know you're the expert when it comes to your own boat the risk of that happening is greatly decreased when we put the pump in your hands. Consider us your waiter on the water. We're here to help you dock, bring you the nozzle, watch your pump, bring you anything you may need from the store, cash you out, and help you get on your way to having fun on the lake!
